State Updates

CHAPA Advocates for Affordable Housing in Supplemental Budget

On October 1st, <u>CHAPA advocated for affordable housing programs</u> to be included in the Legislature's FY2019 supplemental budget. CHAPA requested the budget include funding for new extremely low income housing production, down payment assistance, and resources for lead-paint remediation. The Legislature is expected to take up the supplemental budget this month.

NOFA Released for Gateway Housing Rehabilitation Program

Earlier this month, <u>DHCD released a NOFA</u> for a new Gateway Housing Rehabilitation Program. The program will support the rehabilitation of distressed multifamily properties for households with low- to middle-incomes in Gateway Cities or similar communities. DHCD will make \$3 million available for the program. Applications are due October 31.

DHCD Seeks Comments on AHVP Regulations

DHCD is undertaking a review of regulations governing the Alternative Housing Voucher Program (AHVP). DHCD will host a meeting to discuss the regulation on Wednesday, October 30, with comments due by November 8. More information, including how to RSVP for the meeting, is available at the link above.

DHCD Releases Draft 2020-2021 QAP

On September 25th, <u>DHCD released a draft of the 2020-2021 Qualified Allocation Plan</u> (QAP). The plan determines how DHCD distributes the Low Income Housing Tax Credit and other affordable housing bond programs. Proposed changes to the QAP include raising the minimum requirement for extremely low income housing from 10% to 13% and changing design and scope requirements to encourage green, sustainable, and climate resilient design.

Attorney General Issues Bid Protest Decision on Public Construction Bidding Laws

Last month, the <u>Attorney General's Office issued a bid</u> <u>protest opinion</u>, finding that public construction bidding laws do not apply to the rehabilitation of a privately owned affordable housing development in Springfield. <u>CHAPA</u> <u>filed a brief</u> on behalf of the development.

DHCD Awards Community Development Block Grants

On September 20th, <u>DHCD awarded \$34 million in</u>
<u>Community Development Block Grants</u> (CDBG) to 63
cities and towns. The grants will help rehabilitate 230

Federal Updates

Federal Budget Funded Through November 21

In September, <u>Congress passed a Continuing Resolution</u> (CR) to fund the federal government through November 21. The CR continues FY2019 funding levels for the majority of affordable housing and community development programs. The House and Senate will need to pass the federal spending bills to avoid another government shutdown in November.
